

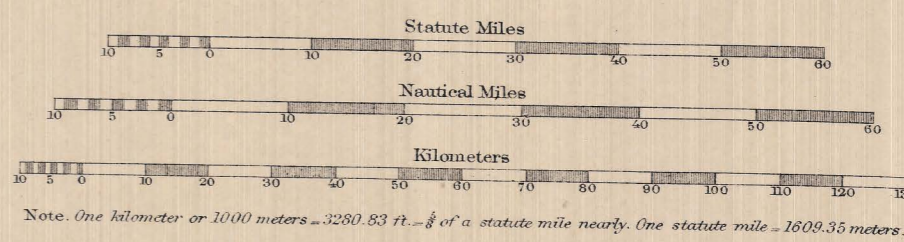


MAP SHOWING AWARD OF ALASKA BOUNDARY TRIBUNAL

AUTHORITIES

TIDES

The predicted time and height of the tide can be obtained from the TIDE TABLES published annually by the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey.

SOUNDINGS

The soundings are in fathoms. Soundings marked thus (f. 6) signify that no bottom was reached at that depth.
* Signifies mud on rock. * Rock awash at low water.

Steamer routes are indicated by a broken line thus

Elevations are given in feet.
