The construction of the present Wolf House in Hoonah was begun in late August 1944 and was completed on April 21, 1945. The lumber used was brought over from Juneau on the boats, Olympic, Washington, and Icy Queen. Jimmie Martin brought some of the lumber up from Seattle. George Dalton Sr. and Jimmie paid for the lumber. Some of the people who helped build the house were: James Grant, Paul White Sr., Mark Williams, Moses Smith, Lonnie Houston, John Marvin, John C. Johnson, Frank Willson, R. McKinley, and Albert Jackson. Paul White Sr. was the foreman. Jimmie Martin and George Dalton were Bosses. Willie Ross was the elder Eagle in charge of the house until his death in 1960. Since then George Dalton has been in charge of the Wolf House.
