4. What is your present occupation? *I am fishing now and in winter I do the carpenter work*

5. Tell something of your present home *My home is in Sitka*

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings, or money do you have? *I have Gas boat 28 ft long with six horsepower engine in it and name is C. White cost \$100.*

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? *I never was in Indian service*

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I having a hard battle to fight every day. Sometimes I almost get discouraged in life that is in line of Christian work. But I always ask God to help me, I am fishing in a Gas boat 36 ft long with 12 horse power Standard engine and she makes between 7 or 8 miles an hour. This summer was a hard luck summer for me and my wife our dear little died on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June, and I am a deep sorry every day. But since I received your letter I feel much better, the you have never forgotten me. We got another little <sup>boy</sup> and he is very sick too and the Dr can do any thing for him now. This is all I love to tell you from your dear old Carlisle friend. Oh! Just wish I could get the whole paper now.
